

SENATOR WHITNEY: Have you all voted? Clerk will record.

CLERK: 30 ayes,,,31 ayes no nays, Mr. President.

SENATOR WHITNEY: The bill is advanced. Senator Carpenter.

SENATOR CARPENTER: I move we pass over 434, it's a highly controversial bill and it'll take all this morning and probably all next week.

SENATOR WHITNEY: Senator Carpenter has asked unanimous consent to pass over LB434. Are there any objections? I see no objections, therefore, we'll pass over the bill. The next bill is LB608.

CLERK: LB608 read.

SENATOR WHITNEY: Chair recognizes Senator Maresh. Senator Carpenter.

SENATOR CARPENTER: If the Clerk will advise the Chairman of the Committee and he introduces a bill that the bill is coming up, then we will not catch the Chairman or the people off center. Now, these Pages have been around here long enough. One of them ought to be able to do this and do it so everybody is alerted.

SENATOR MARESH: Mr. President and members of the Legislature, I move that the committee amendments be adopted. What this does, on page 2, line 6 you strike two and show it stricken and insert three, and on mine 8 strike 2 and show it stricken and insert 3. We felt, as a committee, that this should be increased from \$250 to \$350. I move that the committee amendment be adopted.

SENATOR WHITNEY: Any discussion? We'll take a voice vote. Those in favor of the...Senator Richendifer do you wish to be recognized?

SENATOR RICHENDIFER: Mr. Chairman, I didn't want my amendment on this passed over. Everyone is hurrying here.

SENATOR WHITNEY: Senator Richendifer, the Chair did not hear what you just said.

SENATOR RICHENDIFER: I just wanted to alert the Chair that I have an amendment for this bill also. The question has been moved here.

SENATOR WHITNEY: Alright, we'll take a voice vote on the committee amendment. Those in favor of the committee amendment say aye, those opposed no. Amendment carries.

CLERK: OK, now Mr. President there is pending an amendment offered by Senator Richendifer and the amendment is set out in full in the Legislative Journal. It provides as follows: that a new section every County Board in the Journal on page 449. Every County Board by January 1, 1975 shall conspicuously post at each abandoned or neglected cemetery or Indian burial ground within their respective jurisdiction, a sign or marker designating such area to be abandoned or neglected.

SENATOR WHITNEY: Senator Richendifer?

SENATOR RICHENDIFER: Mr. Chairman and members of the Legislature, what this does is that it requires the counties to identify these spots. Now, there are some burial grounds, Indian burial grounds, in the state that are not marked. People have a tendency to go out
