

SENATOR WHITNEY: I move that the legislature approve these appointees by the Governor Rudolph Paralez, Lowell Shaffer, and Conrad Lawrence.

PRESIDENT: And now the question is shall the three appointments of the Governor as explained by Senator Whitney be approved. All those in favor of the approval will vote aye those opposed will vote no. This vote is to confirm the appointment of the three men as explained by Senator Whitney. Have you all voted? Once again the Chair would ask if you have all voted? The Clerk will record.

CLERK: 28 ayes 0 Nays and 21 not voting. Vote appears on page 539 of the Legislative Journal.

PRESIDENT: The appointments are confirmed.

CLERK: Read Carpenter motion.

PRESIDENT: Senator Carpenter.

SENATOR CARPENTER: A brief word of explanation. I have been informed and by those who desired, it is immaterial. We have not had any real sense of the direction to the people involved in the motion as to what they can do upon request of other people outside of this body. All it does the information is confidential and lists of names and things like that should not be given out by the employees without the permission of the Legislature or the Executive Council. I move for its adoption.

PRESIDENT: Any further discussion of the motion. Question is then shall the motion be adopted. Do you all understand the motion? Clerk will read the motion again please.

CLERK: They all have copies of it.

PRESIDENT: OK, all those that are in favor of adopting the motion shall vote aye, those opposed vote no. Voting on Senator Carpenter's motion regarding confidentiality of records. It takes 25 votes. Thank you. Clerk will record.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Motion is adopted. Senator Cal Carsten.

SENATOR CARSTEN: Mr. President, a point of information. I am wondering and I think that we discussed this before on the floor but I am wondering again why we do not have a committee statement from the Committee on Committees. I think that the information as to who appeared for, who appeared against is up interest to the body and I think that the committee on committees should be requested to print this in their report, when it is printed in the daily Journal. I think that it is important that we have this. We can't always all be at these committee hearings and it is interesting to know the testimony that is then given, and I think that we need to have that report. I would like to have an answer from Senator Whitney, the Chairman or anyone else that cares to speak.

PRESIDENT: Thank you, Senator Whitney, do you care to respond?
