PRESIDENT: All right, he has decided he has not. Then we are back to considering the bill and we are still on Final Reading and that still requires the Senators to be in their seats. Now the question is shall LB 986 pass with the emergency clause attached. All those in favor vote aye, all those opposed vote no. Now before we take the vote I have Senator Prouds light on. Does that indicate that Senator Proud wants to be recognized? I have Senator Carpenters light on and wonder if that indicates he wants to be recognized. All right, thank you sir. Now then, have you all voted? The Clerk will record.

CLERK: Printed in Journal on page 558.
45 ayes, 0 nays and 4 not voting

PRESIDENT: Stand by, Senator Marvel voting aye. Thank you, the bill is passed with the emergency clause attached. Ready for the Final Reading please of LB 987. Clerk will read the bill.

CLERK: read LB 987

PRESIDENT: All provisions of law relative to procedure having been complied with, the question is, 'Shall the bill pass with the emergency clause attached?' All those in favor vote aye, all those opposed vote no. Once again have you all voted? Clerk will record.

PRESIDENT: The bill is passed with the emergency clause attached. Are there any resolutions on the desk.

CLERK: Yes. Legislative Resolution 115. Printed in Journal on page 559 and 560 (read by Clerk)

PRESIDENT: Be referred to the Executive Board. Are there other resolutions. Speaker Proud for what purpose do you rise?

SEPAKER PROUD: Mr. President, I wish to make an announce. All committee hearings with one exception of Public Health and thats just a few bills on the next day. With that exception, all bills now in that legislature that have been set for hearing by February 18 or before. So I believe that we can absolutely depend at this point in time anyway, that we can go into all day sessions on approximately that date. I say approximately because we might even be able to start all day sessions a day or two before or a day or two afterwards that we can pretty plan that on February 18th as the last time that we will be in half day session.
