

SENATOR CARPENTER: Oh...

PRESIDENT: First bill, now then...

CLERK: This is the bill dealing with the reapportionment of the Supreme Court, Request Number 1572.

PRESIDENT: Alright, question is then, shall the bill be introduced? All those in favor vote aye, those opposed vote no. Motion still takes 30 votes. This is the motion on the first bill only. Once again, have you all voted? This is the vote for the introduction of the first bill only. Senator Syas.

SENATOR SYAS: I want to say one thing. I still think that we handled this wrong. It is alright with me if you get the 30 votes to introduce it, but don't you suspend the rules, isn't this a double action here that you are taking?

PRESIDENT: Stand by. Senator Duis.

SENATOR DUIS: Senator Syas, we have gone through this before, the motion to suspend the rules is not debatable and it also is not subject to an overruling or a ruling from the Chair.

A motion to introduce bills could be both. By making a motion to include both, you have a double motion with the word and in there to suspend rules and do something. We to do it that way we suspend the rules to do a specific action first. Then do the specific action next, whether you want to introduce them one at a time or in a bunch to be included in the second motion. But not in the first one because the motion to suspend the rules is not subject to a ruling by the chair.

PRESIDENT: Senator Anderson, what is your pleasure?

SENATOR ANDERSON: We need just four more votes, I hate to ask for a call of the house for that.

PRESIDENT: Thank you, Clerk will record.

CLERK: 30 ayes, 2 nays Mr. president.

PRESIDENT: Bill is introduced.

SENATOR ANDERSON: Mr. Chairman, I would move the introduction of the second bill.

PRESIDENT: Lets make sure that the body understands what this one is.

SENATOR ANDERSON: This is the one dealing with the residents requirements for the Supreme Court Judges.
