

SENATOR MURPHY: If you will.

PRESIDENT: Alright, are there objections? Are there objections to setting 692 for March 17th? Any objections? Hearing none, it is so ordered and will be done.

CLERK: Read Revenue Committee report.

PRESIDENT: Senator Stahmer.

SENATOR STAHMER: Mr. President, I ask unanimous consent to be excused the morning of the 18th.

PRESIDENT: Alright, Senator Stahmer is asking unanimous consent to be excused the morning of the 18th. Are there objections to his absence? Hearing none, so ordered. You got away with that. Bills in Final Reading we have three 513, 652, and 762. The Chair would respectfully ask that we begin to clear the floor, get the Senators in their seats and we could begin final reading with LB513, as soon as the floor is cleared. Senator Murphy did they change March 17th for some other purpose or...

SENATOR MURPHY: They didn't but they slipped Sunday in ahead of Monday, and Sunday is kind of hard to get a vote in here so may I make that the 18th?

PRESIDENT: Lets see now we want 692 set for March 18th. Did the assistant Clerk catch that one? Change 692 to the 18th. Well we have a motion relating to 513 for the moment so lets move to the final reading of LB652. First bill on Final Reading this morning if I may have your attention will be 652. We are attempting to begin Final Reading on LB652, that does require the Senators to be in their seats. Senator MURPHY do you still have a problem back there?

SENATOR MURPHY: No, I would like to have just a moment to visit with Senator Moylan on this....I thought that this body had reduced that amount from greater to lesser and had restored the original wording on this bill.

PRESIDENT: Do you want to come down and ask him a question?

SENATOR MURPHY: If I may.

PRESIDENT: Stand by Senator Moylan he is coming down.

SENATOR MURPHY: Wasn't this reduced to lesser Senator Moylan?

PRESIDENT: Senator Moylan

SENATOR MOYLAN: Mr. Chairman and members it was my understanding that it had been taken out and left the original language. I don't know whether you make the point there or not. I believe that it was you that was asking for it.

SENATOR MURPHY: It was and it was my understanding that we restored the original language, to lesser in that one instance.

SENATOR MOYLAN: I don't understand why it wasn't. I thought that you had offered the amendment, of course it wasn't at my request at all.
