

PRESIDENT: Well one of them has already confessed. But the other one I can't help you with.

SENATOR SIMPSON: That is the only reason to me that when I get this it is sometimes something important to me and I would like to talk to the person who is doing it so I wish we could get them on in.....

PRESIDENT: Good point. One of them is by the Professor.

SENATOR SIMPSON: Professor? Which professor, we have two?

PRESIDENT: Of economics. Are there any other motions on the desk?

CLERK: None.

PRSIDENT: Any other ...ready for the consideration of bills on General File, the first of which this morning would be 327. Good question. That is the Chair's fault but I lost my notes. We have to go back and finish considering 997 before we can move to the General File consideration of 327. 997.

CLERK: LB997 IS the appropriations bill for the appropriation of special or selected agencies of the state. There is a Carpenter amendment which has been adopted. There is presently a Whitney amendment which has been inserted in full in the Legislative Journal, I hope, is it in there? What page? Then there are some additional....here it is on page 626, is the Whitney amendment then there are some additional amendments.

PRESIDENT: We a had adopted the Carpenter amendment we are now down to the Whitney amendment, is that correct?

CLERK: That is correct. Whitney amendment appears in full on page 626.

PRESIDENT: Well, stand by, just a minute. Senator Marvel, we have moved back to 997 because it is unfinished business from yesterday. According to the adgenda that is the way the chair is bound. So now Senator Whitney has an amendment to 997. Senator Carpenter.

SENATOR CARPENTER: I was talking to Senator Marvel about this by indirection and I would like to suggest that because of amendments that have not been prepared yet, there are amendments which have been prepared but I would presume since we took it up, that we would want to attempt to finish the bill and move it over. I would ask to pass it over temporarily until we discuss the two bills, Senator Waldron's bill and 984 ahead of the budget bill.

PRESIDENT: Lets see if we can get away with this with unanimous consent. Does anyone object to passing over 997 at this time, and a until we get all of the amendments then? Senator Whitney do you object?

SENATOR WHITNEY: Mr. President, was this just to take up then Senator Waldron's bill?

SENATOR CARPENTER: Waldron's and 984.

PRESIDENT: Take up 327 and 984.
