SENATOR CHAMBERS:vote that would stay here.

PRESIDENT: That's right, if it fails to get 25 votes, it stays on General File.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you.

PRESIDENT: Are there other amendments to the bill or anything? All right. The motion then is to advance, I assume. Senator Murphy, do you want to renew your motion to advance the bill?

SENATOR MURPHY: I would renew the motion, yes. We have much work to do here. Let's get it over with.

PRESIDENT: All right, the motion is to advance LB327 from General File to E & R initial. All of those in favor of advancing the bill, vote aye, all those opposed, vote no. Motion is to advance LB327. Have you all voted? Once again, have you all voted? The motion is to advance LB327 from General File to E & R initial. Clerk will record. 327 is advanced. Wait just a minute, before you read the reports. The Chair would like the privilege of introducing some very distinguished visitors we have today seated under the north balcony. We have Ray R. Sodin who is Commander-in-Chief of the Veterans of Foreign Wars of the United States from Bensonville, Illinois. He's accompanied by James C. Cannolly, the State Commander of Veterans of Foreign Wars, Department of Nebraska, from Omaha, and Condon King, the State Adjutant Quartermaster of the Veterans of Foreign Wars for Nebraska, Lincoln, Nebraska. Mr. Sodin, we'd like to have you stand up. We'd like to welcome you to Nebraska. Thank you. Now, we have announcements from the desk.

CLERK: Read Standing Committee Reports. Mr. President, Education Committee reports 852 to General File as amended. Signed, Senator Warner. Read rest of Standing Committee Reports. Mr. President, I move to suspend the rules and to consider LB1034 at this time. Signed, Senator Duis.

PRESIDENT: Senator Duis.

SENATOR DUIS: Mr. President, my motion is to suspend the rules to take up LB1034 at this time. It's necessary to move this bill which is a constitutional amendment across so that it can pass final reading and be signed by the 28th of this month in order to get it on the primary ballot. I think we're all interested in this bill because this is the one where the Constitution could be changed so that the vote and the order in the Resolutions of this Legislature will not all have to be presented to the Governor and cause him a tremendous work load and something that hasn't been done for years and years and years. It's merely a corrective measure in the Constitution to eliminate these provisions so I would ask to suspend the rules and this will require 30 votes.

PRESIDENT: Is there any further discussion of that motion? Senator Marvel, do you want to discuss the motion? All right. Senator Dickinson, do you want to discuss the motion? You have something else and I realize that. We've got the motion before us to suspend the rules and take up LB1034 at this time. All those in favor of suspending the rules and taking up the bill, vote aye. All those opposed, vote no. We have before us Senator Duis' motion to suspend the rules and it would take up, apparently, an emergency situation involving LB1034. Motion is to suspend the rules and take up LB1034 at this time.
