PRESIDENT: Thank you, Senator Carpenter. I apparently was not in the Chair at the time when that happened. And the Clerk advises me that we can handle it. We appreciate your suggestion. Now let's see. Senator Fred Carstens, got what purpose do you rise?

SENATOR FRED CARSTENS: Mr. President, may I inquire has it been definitely decided when we go on all day session?

PRESIDENT: The Chair understands the date of, I think February 18th. Let me refer this question to Speaker Proud. Speaker Proud, Senator Fred Carstens asking what approximate date we go into full day sessions? Is the Chair's assumption correct on about February 18th.

SPEAKER PROUD: Yes, I think there was about the 19th, I believe. I don't recall a particular motion, but I believe it was that the hearings were to be concluded as nearly as possible on the 18th and that would make us go into the session on the 19th. Of course, if in fact we do have too many committee hearings obviously we wouldn't go into all day sessions the 19th. It's quite conceivable we might have to extend that a day or two which doesn't bother me any because maybe we need a couple afternoons to catch up on executive work and correspondence etc. I say 19th is the target date.
