SENATOR CARPENTER: When we reach General File I ask unanimous consent we start on Bill 756.

PRESIDENT: 756

SENATOR CARPENTER: The bills ahead of that are certainly controversial to say the least and we might as well start where it isn't. Unless somebody has some objection.

PRESIDENT: Senator Moylan are you objecting to starting at 756.

SENATOR MOYLAN: Well, I've been ready with 641 for about 2 weeks now. They have been skirting it, and I don't believe it is controversial.

PRESIDENT: Stand by for just a moment. We will clear this up first. All right, Senator Carpenter withdraws his motion here, for the moment at least. Read..we have another motion apparently on the desk.

CLERK: Mr. President, I move to suspend the rules and withdraw LB 656 and cancel the hearing. (Signed) Senator Dickinson. This is the bill where the motion was put in yesterday to withdraw it, but in light of the fact that there is a committee hearing it can't be done that way.

PRESIDENT: Senator Dickinson.

SENATOR DICKINSON: Yes.

CLERK: Also LB 928.

SENATOR DICKINSON: Mr. President, I ask to suspend the rules to be able to withdraw LB 928.

PRESIDENT: And cancel the hearing, right?

SENATOR DICKINSON: Pardon?

PRESIDENT: And cancel the hearing. All right, is there a need for further discussion of that particular motion by Senator Dickinson. All right, do you understand the question? He's asking ..

CLERK: 928.

PRESIDENT: 928. Got it. The question is shall the rules be suspended and Senator Dickinson be allowed to withdraw LB 928 and cancel the hearing. That motion requires 30 votes. All those in favor of Senator Dickinson's motion vote aye, all those opposed vote not. Thank you. Clerk will record.

CLERK: 30 ayes, 1 nay, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: O.K. The motion carries, the bill is withdrawn and the hearing is cancelled. Are there other motions
