Chambers. All those in favor, say aye. Those opposed, say no. The committee amendments are adopted then. Now, are there other amendments?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: I move that the bill as amended be advanced to E & R initial.

PRESIDENT: Now, the motion is to advance LB811 as amended. Is there need for further discussion? Then, the question is, shall LB811 be advanced from General File to E & R initial. All those in favor, say aye. All those opposed, say no. Advancing LB811. Yes, sir, as amended. Senator Nore, for what purpose do you rise?

SENATOR NORE: Well, I'm just wondering whether this probably is controversial.

PRESIDENT: It's got 26 votes, it's not controversial.

SENATOR NORE: Well, this might be sort of a sleeper, too.

PRESIDENT: Fine, punch your button.

SENATOR NORE: We can probably do it later on but we may have folks sent in here to run for offices that might take us over.

PRESIDENT: Are you not voting then, Senator Nore? Okay. Senator Nore is not voting. All right. Clerk will record.

CLERK: 30 ayes, no nays, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Bill is advanced. Moves us on to LB779. Senator Mahoney's bill....

CLERK: Read LB779. There are committee amendments by Senator Syas' Constitutional Revision and Recreation Committee.

PRESIDENT: Senator Syas.

SENATOR SYAS: Senator Mahoney brought these amendments to the committee and I'd like to have him explain them.

PRESIDENT: Okay, Senator Mahoney.

SENATOR MAHONEY: Mr. President, the amendments, the others are housekeeping. The major amendment is that this bill would have been treated as the public access hunting bill similar to the State of Iowa's. It gives the same laws that Iowa's had and the committee accepted the amendment and with the help of Senator Wiltse that we placed the amendment on.

PRESIDENT: Any further discussion of the committee amendments? All those in favor of adopting the, whoops, Senator Warner. Go ahead, sir.

SENATOR WARNER: Yeah, Senator Mahoney, if he'd yield.

SENATOR MAHONEY: Yes, Senator Warner.

SENATOR WARNER: This has something to do with shooting from the roadway, right.

SENATOR MAHONEY: Yes, it's similar to the coyote bill we passed a week ago. Be the lesser amount, it would be the shotgun rather than the rifle.

SENATOR WARNER: Pardon.

SENATOR MAHONEY: It would be a shotgun rather than a rifle.
