CLERK: 23 ayes, 9 nays, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Motion carries. Now, at the next bell, we need you to indicate your presence. You are under a call of the house and the Chair would like to have you be in your seats, please. Senator Dickinson. Senator Dickinson voting aye on the original motion.

CLERK: Senator Dickinson voting aye on the original motion.

PRESIDENT: We're under call of the house. The motion before us is that when we adjourn today, we adjourn until next Monday. Senator Duis voting aye. Have you all indicated your presence? Senator Richendifer, we're under call of the house. Please take your seat. Senator Lewis. The motion is to raise the call. All those in favor of raising the call, vote aye. All those opposed, vote no. Motion is to raise the call. Senator Frank Lewis. Clerk will record.

CLERK: 34 ayes to raise the call.

PRESIDENT: Call is raised. Read the tally of the original motion.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 20 nays.

PRESIDENT: Motion carries and then when we adjourn today, we will adjourn until Monday. Without a specified time, I want to remind the Body that would be 9:00 o'clock Monday unless that is amended. The motion was not made for 10:00 o'clock, the motion was just to adjourn until Monday, 9, now if you want to change that fine. Senator Lewis.

SENATOR LEWIS: Mr. Chairman, I move to make the motion read 10:00 a.m. Monday morning.

PRESIDENT: All right, is there further discussion of that motion? All those in favor of adjournment until 10:00 a.m. Monday, say aye. Those opposed, say no. All right, those in favor of adjournment until 10:00, vote aye. All those opposed, vote no. Simple majority is required on this one. Motion is to adjourn until 10:00 o'clock Monday when we adjourn today rather than 9:00 o'clock as is presumed when the motion is originally made unless the time is specified. This is for 10:00 o'clock, right. All right, have you all voted? I'll tell you what, Senator Savage, I'm going to wait for you. All right, have you all voted? Once again, have you all voted? Motion is to adjourn until 10:00 o'clock Monday. Have you all voted? Why doesn't somebody ask for a call of the house? Clerk will record.

CLERK: 21 ayes, 23 nays.

PRESIDENT: Senator Lewis, your motion lost. We're adjourned until 9:00 unless you can change it between now and noon.

CLERK: Read advancement of LB877 to General File. LB976 to General File. Mr. President, your enrolling clerk for your reports that we did on this day at 8:20 present to the Governor LB608, LB639, LB715, LB729 and LB778, signed, Barbara Jackson, enrolling clerk.

PRESIDENT: Okay, while the Legislature was in session and capable of transacting business, I have signed LB664, LB666, and LB683. Do we have any more committee hearings or reports, notices of committee hearings or reports? All right, ready for the bills on final reading. Heading those this morning would be LB17A. The Chair once again would like to respectfully asked that the floor be cleared and senators at least get in the proximity of their seats.
