

PRESIDENT: Well we haven't really, well we will start that maybe they will come in while we are going through this.

SENATOR BARNETT: I had about 15 people in here at the time when he started. I thought that it needed more than that. It is a very important issue.

PRESIDENT: That is understandable. We are under a call of the house then. This is a roll call vote. Lets make sure, may I please have your attention? Lets make sure that we understand what we are voting on. You are voting on placing 619 on General File not withstanding the action of the committee. The Clerk will begin the roll call vote, at the back.

CLERK: Roll call vote. 18 ayes, 28 nays and 3 not voting. Vote appears on page 719 of the Legislative Journal.

PRESIDENT: Motion fails to return the bill to General or to put the bill on General File. Senator C. Carsten for what purpose do you rise?

SENATOR C. CARSTEN: Mr. President, I move the call be raised.

PRESIDENT: The motion is to raise the call. All those in favor of raising the call, vote aye. All those opposed, vote no. The motion now is to raise the call. Thank you. Clerk will record.

CLERK: 39 ayes to raise the call.

PRESIDENT: Call is raised.

CLERK: Mr. President, we have a motion on the desk.

PRESIDENT: Read the motion.

CLERK: I move for the introduction of the attached bill. Signed, Senator Burbach. It's a bill relating to accountants to define public accounting experience. It's signed by the members of the Revenue Committee.

PRESIDENT: Chair recognizes Senator Jules Burbach of Crofton, Nebraska.

SENATOR BURBACH: Mr. President and members of the Legislature. Very reluctantly do I ask that this bill be introduced at this time. However, it is an important issue with the Department of Revenue. They've brought the bill to us. Yesterday, after visiting with our committee, it was determined that it was signed by, I think, 7 or 8 of our members at least. It was much more than a majority. I move to spin the rules for the introduction of the bill.

PRESIDENT: Question is, shall the bill.....Senator Kelly. The motion is to introduce the bill. Senator Kelly.

SENATOR KELLY: Mr. President, a question of Senator Burbach.

PRESIDENT: Does Senator Burbach yield?

SENATOR BURBACH: You bet.

SENATOR KELLY: Senator Burbach, has this been across the Governor's desk to know whether he wants the agency to enter the bill or not?

SENATOR BURBACH: Mr. Peters, the head of the Department of Revenue, brought the bill to us and I would presume it was with his concurrence but I could not answer your question directly.
