PRESIDENT: Speaker Proud is next to speak, and then Senator Chambers.

SPEAKER PROUD: Well, Mr. President, let's get on with the vote here and lay it over whatever Senator Dickinson wants to do. It's not that important.

PRESIDENT: Speaker Proud, I'm sorry I was distracted. What was it you wanted to do. You are passing? All right, Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Say it's well is passed. I'm just kidding Dick.

PRESIDENT: Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Here is what I would say, Mr. President and members of the body. From what I've understood of the discussion everything is clear about the amendment because it's that brief one that is related to the name. And since that is what we're talking about, I'm opposed to the laying over of the bill. And I would like to see the bone of contention I think was the name primarily.

PRESIDENT: Well, Senator Chambers, we have a two page committee amendment. It's what.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: But I mean based on Senator Goodrich.

PRESIDENT: is behind the discussion here.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Then what Senator Goodrich asked Senator Dickinson, may I ask Senator Dickinson?

PRESIDENT: Yes, go ahead. Senator Dickinson do you yield?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Was it primarily the name aspect of it?

SENATOR DICKINSON: Primarily.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: That's my understanding. So I think an issue like that is not a brainbuster. We don't have excedrin headache number one as a result of it, so I'm opposed to our laying it over. And I think we ought to go ahead and deal with it now.

PRESIDENT: Next to speak is Senator Stahmer. The motion is to lay the bill over. Senator Stahmer. That's all we're going to do.

SENATOR STAHMER: Well, Mr. President, I think it is important to get this bill moving, because we have to make decisions in budget and the longer we delay this bill the more it holds us up. If there is an inaccuracy in it, I think it can be corrected on Select File. I would like to move the question.

PRESIDENT: The question has been moved. Does the Chair see five hands? The question is, shall the debate now close. All those in favor of closing debate, vote aye. All those opposed vote no. This motion is to close debate on the motion to lay over the bill. That's all it is. This is closing debate. 25 votes is required. Thank you. The Clerk will record.
