PRESIDENT: O.K. Senator Carpenter what do you do with the bill?

SENATOR CARPENTER: I move the bill be advanced to E & R for Initial.

PRESIDENT: You have heard the motion and the second. All those in favor vote aye, those opposed vote no. The Chair votes aye. Have you all voted. Clerk will record the vote.

CLERK: 28 ayes, 5 nays, Mr. President on motion to advance.

PRESIDENT: What was the vote?

CLERK: 28 ayes, 5 nays.

PRESIDENT: O.K. The motion carried, the bill is advanced. And the Chair recognizes Senator Carpenter. For what purpose do you rise.

SENATOR CARPENTER: A point of order. The Budget Committee, I understand still has some hearings to hold. I would only like to suggest that we meet this afternoon, we meet for example to deal only with noncontroversial bills, and I would suggest that if you adopt this motion we start with LB 7
