CLERK: 27 ayes, no nays, 22 not voting.

PRESIDENT: The appointees are approved by the Legislature. Any motion to reconsider.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Fellman made a motion to place LB 1033 on General File notwithstanding the action of the committee. He desires to take it up at this time.

PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes Senator Fellman.

SENATOR FELLMAN: Mr. President, and members of the Legislature. This is the bill in which the door was shut on the faces of Senator Cavanaugh and myself. That we spoke about yesterday. This is the bill that was killed by the Constitutional Revision Committee. The purpose of the bill

is to reapportion the districts of the State Supreme Court. The reason I'm raising this on the floor, asking this to be raised from the committee is to point out to the members of this Legislature that the very report itself prepared by Senator Syas indicates his own agreement with the principle involved in the bill.
