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It would help relieve a problem. The problem is this, the schools are included inadvertently in language last time that they have to give teachers notice 90 days, which is about right now, and any amending of a contract. They also have to do it if they were to discharge them. But in the case of the amending of a contract, like just in the change of the assignment of the teacher's

PRESIDENT: Senator Warner are you asking that we take up 857?

SENATOR WARNER: Yes, but I was just explaining it, so they would know why I was bringing it up, Mr. Chairman.

PRESIDENT: Are you asking unanimous consent that we take that up. Senator Whitney and then Senator Warner.

SENATOR WHITNEY: Before you do that, Mr. President, LB 302 was to come up next, and I'd like to ask unanimous consent that it be put on General File, for it..would it be..bracketed for...What did you say? O.k. O.K.

PRESIDENT: You are ask..Senator Whitney you are asking unanimous consent to bracket LB 302 for a.

SENATOR WHITNEY: I'll withdraw...I'll withdraw.

PRESIDENT: All right. Senator Warner getting back to your request. You are asking unanimous consent to take up what's the number.

SENATOR WARNER: 857

PRESIDENT: 857. No objection.

CLERK: LB857 Title read.

SENATOR WARNER: Mr. President, I move the adoption of the committee amendments, strike all the new language that was introduced, and the only thing that would be done is in line 6, or correction 8 and 9 of the words of any political subdivision of the state would be stricken. Those words that are included in LB 422 of last session and they result in schools, they are having two different dates. One this one and one their own regular law, as to when the teachers have to be notified if their contracts are to be changed. And this in would affect Class, 1, 2, 3 and 6. And they have requested that if this bill could be advanced and expedited, so that there would be perfectly clear as to which deadline schools of this class would have to follow if they were going to either terminate or amend a teacher's contract.

PRESIDENT: Is there any discussion on the committee amendments to 857. President Senator Lewis.

SENATOR LEWIS: I'm doing this earlier, Mr. President, but I didn't understand that it was the committee amendments that struck the entire bill, and I would suggest that we may have a problem, then Senator Warner.

PRESIDENT: Senator Warner.

SENATOR WARNER: Do you object, Senator Lewis.
