SENATOR DUIS: I presume then that would preclude me. I was going to take up a rule change real quick here in the next five minutes but I'll let it go.

PRESIDENT: That's right, that precludes it. Speaker Proud, do you have anything else, your light is still on? Is there business to come before the Body before we recess? The Chair also wants to call to your attention that...Speaker Proud, I have just received notice that the Governor will be leaving the state at 1:00 o'clock this afternoon and that precludes me from presiding this afternoon so you'll have to make some other arrangements. All right, we now have a motion to recess until 2:00 o'clock this afternoon. All those in favor of the motion please say aye. Those opposed say no. The ayes have it, so ordered, we're recessed until 2:00.
