Please pay attention to voting. Those who can be here Friday, who are going to be here Friday...all day. Have you all recorded your presence? I mean those who are going to be here tomorrow. Senator Carpenter.

SENATOR CARPENTER: I think there is an indication we'll have enough here tomorrow to work so I would think we had ought to, even though we'll be here tomorrow, as a suggestion again, move the bills from Select File over to E & R for Engrossment. We have about enough time to do that and probably not enough time to do much else.

CLERK: I've got some more motions here yet.

SENATOR CARPENTER: Okay, I didn't know that.

PRESIDENT: Does anyone wish to object to Senator Carpenter's meritorious decision?

SENATOR HASEBROOCK: Mr. President, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Senator Hasebroock.

SENATOR HASEBROOCK: I move the call be raised.

PRESIDENT: Okay, Clerk clear the board. The motion is to raise the call. It just takes a simple majority. Clerk will record.

CLERK: 17 ayes, 2 nays to raise the call.

PRESIDENT: The call is raised.

CLERK: Mr. President, I move to suspend the rules and return LB802 to the Agricultural Committee. Signed, Senator Schmit.

PRESIDENT: Yes.

SENATOR SCHMIT: Mr. President and members of the Legislature. I'll be very brief. This is Senator Keyes' bill, has to do with establishing alternate delivery points for grain and the committee did kill it in committee. We reported it to the Legislature. Since that time, we've had additional evidence that we felt merited reconsideration of the bill. We've asked that it be returned to our committee and I move that the rules be suspended.

PRESIDENT: The motion is to suspend the rules and return LB802 to the committee...to recommit to the committee.

SENATOR CARPENTER: May I ask Senator Schmit a question?

PRESIDENT: Senator Schmit, will you yield?

SENATOR CARPENTER: Does the committee have a pretty much of a fixed idea what they want in the bill?

SENATOR SCHMIT: Senator Carpenter, we have the bill re-drafted and it has been prepared for returning to the Clerk right now. We can do it in a minute.

SENATOR CARPENTER: Well, why don't you put it on General File and put the amendment on when it comes up?

SENATOR SCHMIT: We could do that. We could perhaps Senator Keyes could move to put it on General File notwithstanding
