SENATOR CARPENTER: Yes, I would amend his motion to do that. There's no use going through the committee.

SENATOR SCHMIT: Very well.

SENATOR CARPENTER: I move we put it on General File notwithstanding the committee's action.

PRESIDENT: This will take....we must suspend the rules anyway so.....

SENATOR SCHMIT: It still takes 30 votes.

PRESIDENT: Senator Schmit, do you wish to.....

SENATOR SCHMIT: I withdraw my motion in favor of Senator Carpenter's motion. Let's go that route.

PRESIDENT: The motion is to suspend the rules and to raise from committee LB802 notwithstanding the action of the committee which will take 30 votes. Those in favor vote aye. Those opposed vote nay. Please pay attention to voting. Senator Nore.

SENATOR NORE: I wanted to ask a question, you've got it, but we don't seem to get recognized. I don't think we need this. We...the government has already designated Hastings, Lincoln and Omaha to receive grain bought on the Chicago Board of Trade. I'm sure of that. Is that true?

PRESIDENT: I'm sorry if I didn't see your light. Clerk will record.

CLERK: 32 ayes on motion to suspend the rules. Now, Mr. President, the motion is to place LB802 on General File. Signed, Senator Schmit.

PRESIDENT: The motion is to place.....Senator Schmit.

SENATOR SCHMIT: No response.

PRESIDENT: Motion is to place LB802 on General File. Senator Warner. Any more discussion on putting this on General File? Those in favor vote aye. Those opposed vote nay. We need 25 votes. Have you all voted? Clerk will record.

CLERK: 28 ayes, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: LB802 is placed on General File.

CLERK: Now, Mr. President, I move to return LB892 to the Telecommunications Committee for consideration of an amendment.

PRESIDENT: Who has the motion?

CLERK: Signed, Senator Goodrich, Skarda, Clark, Waldron and Warner.

PRESIDENT: Senator Goodrich.
