PRESIDENT: You've heard the motion to advance LB865A. All those in favor of the advancement of the bill please say aye. Those opposed say no. So ordered, LB865A is advanced.

SENATOR CAVANAUGH: I move LB983A be advanced to E & R for Engrossing.

CLERK: Mr. President, there is an amendment on that to add the emergency clause. Signed, Senator Carpenter.

PRESIDENT: Very good. Senator Carpenter.

SENATOR CARPENTER: I move the amendment be adopted.

PRESIDENT: All right, is there any further discussion? The question is, if you want to add the emergency clause to LB983A. All those in favor vote aye. All those opposed vote no. Senator Carpenter is proposing the addition of the emergency clause to LB983A on Select File. That motion still requires 25 votes. Once again, have you all voted? Thank you. Clerk will record.

CLERK: 25 ayes, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: The emergency clause is added to LB983A. Senator Cavanaugh.

SENATOR CAVANAUGH: I move LB983A as amended be advanced to E & R for Engrossing.

PRESIDENT: You've heard the motion to advance the bill... as amended. All those in favor of advancement of the bill, please say aye. Those opposed say no. So ordered, LB983A is advanced. Now, we have LB614, this morning, it was moved from Final Reading.

CLERK: Mr. President, I move to return LB9.....

PRESIDENT: LB614.

CLERK: I'm sorry. Mr. President, this morning LB614 was returned on a motion by Senator Fellman to Select File, for specific amendment. To exempt cash contributions under \$25. That motion is now pending.

PRESIDENT: Senator Fellman. He's coming. It never rains, it pours. We're ready for your motion on LB614 which would amend the cash contribution section on Select File.

SENATOR FELLMAN: Oh, that's to amend the cash contributions?

PRESIDENT: Correct, sir.

SENATOR FELLMAN: Is that correct? Now is to \$25. This was argued, this was discussed in length this morning. This would merely allow contribution to cash up to \$25, is a.... should I move to adopt the amendment?

PRESIDENT: Yes, right.

SENATOR FELLMAN: So move.

PRESIDENT: Any further discussion? Senator Barnett.

SENATOR BARNETT: Mr. President, members of the Legislature. Could you answer a question, would it be proper to try and amend his amendment now or is that something that I do later?
