PRESIDENT: Are you all through discussing the Kelly amendment? Then Senator Kelly.

SENATOR KELLY: Yes.

PRESIDENT: All right, Senator Kelly has asked for the adoption of that amendment to his bill, LB677 on General File. If you are in favor of the motion, please say aye, those opposed say no. All those in favor of the motion vote aye, all those opposed vote no. Now if I can have your attention, I'll explain what we are voting on. If I may have your attention. Thank you. You are voting on the Kelly amendment which is found on page 744 of the Legislative Journal to his bill 677 which is bracketed on General File for discussion today. This is the Kelly amendment. You are voting on the Kelly amendment to 677 on General File bracketed for discussion today, the amendment is bound on page 744 of the Legislative Journal. Now, have you all voted? Once again the Chair would ask if you have all voted? O.K. You are voting on the Kelly amendment. All right. Senator Kelly, what is your pleasure.

SENATOR KELLY: A Call of the House.

PRESIDENT: O.K. Record the vote here. Senator Kelly has asked a Call of the House. The next bell please indicate your presence. The motion is for a Call of the House. Senator Kelly has asked for a Call of the House. The Chair is inquiring if you support a Call of the House, this is the time to vote. All right, Clerk will record.

CLERK: 16 ayes, 17 nays on Call of the House.

PRESIDENT: Motion is lost on Call of the House. We are back to the original.

CLERK: 16 ayes, 19 nays.

PRESIDENT: All right that motion is lost for the amendment to 677. Are there other amendments to the bill? Senator Syas. We have the amendments up here to be discussed on the bill. We are still discussing 677. Just stand by here. Do we have other motions on the desk here. It seems to me we have to take them in the order they are filed on the desk. Stand by just a minute.

CLERK: If you wish not to take his motion to kill, then there is a motion offered by Senator Mahoney, to amend.

PRESIDENT: What is your pleasure, Senator Mahoney. Senator Mahoney, is withdrawing his amendment.'

CLERK: Senator Mahoney is withdrawing his amendment.

PRESIDENT: In preference to Senator Cavanaugh's amendment then to the bill. O.K. Senator Cavanaugh. We have your amendment to the bill now, BEFORE the body. There is also a motion to kill, I understand on the desk. We will take them in the order ~~th~~ they came in.
