PRESIDENT: Senator Goodrich, is it correct you have other amendments to the bill.

SENATOR GOODRICH: No, the other amendments that Senator Duis is referring to is in the event that other amendments get adopted we are prepared with other amendments. But the idea is this, I would like to see Senator Carpenter's amendments printed in the Journal. We will take it up first thing in the morning. We will take up the bill first thing in the morning. If Senator Schmit, for example, can't be here tomorrow, then let's take up his amendment right now, and we will see what we want to do with it.

PRESIDENT: Right now we have the unanimous consent motion, and I'd, and that's the one which says that the Carpenter amendments will be printed in the Journal and the bill will be laid over. And that's where the Chair is. You've offered to include Senator Schmit's motions in that and that is where the Chair is. We now have before us a motion for unanimous consent to print the amendments in the Journal, and lay the bill over. Period. Now, Senator Goodrich.

SENATOR GOODRICH: I have to object to that. Just for the sake of disposing of it. What we'd like to do is go ahead and concede to Senator Carpenter's request for printing of his amendments in the Journal, and we'll take it up tomorrow. So that's no sweat. But when it comes to Senator Schmit's amendment, I wanted to take that up right now. So let's just hold off on the laying it over until tomorrow, until we get through with Senator Schmit's amendment.

PRESIDENT: All right, let's try it that way then. Does anybody object to Senator Schmit.

SENATOR SCHMIT: Mr. President, I object to taking up only my amendment at this time. I think that those amendments of mine and Senator Carpenter's should both be printed in the Journal. And that they should be taken up together, and I think that the wishes are well outlined, I don't know what Senator Goodrich intends to prove by pursuing the matter at this time. I think those are the things, and I think that Senator Carpenter has pointed out there are very few people who really understand, and these amendments need to be taken into consideration together, and so I would object to Senator Goodrich's motion to act on mine at this time.

PRESIDENT: All right, then the unanimous consent motion to print the amendments in the Journal and lay the bill over is lost. Now what is your pleasure, gentlemen. We will go back to where we didn't have the motion. We still have LB656 in front of us with the proposed amendments by Senator Carpenter. Senator Goodrich.

SENATOR GOODRICH: Am I on, O.K. I move that we take up Senator Carpenter amendment, and then the Senator Schmit amendment right now.

PRESIDENT: All right, the motion is to take up the Senator Carpenter amendment at this time. Is there need for further discussion of that particular motion then. Do you object.. Well now wait a minute...that's puts the Chair in a jam that I didn't realize. That is that Senator Schmit's amendment was up here
