SENATOR SNYDER: Mr. President, I would move to bracket LB785A on General File.

There is also a amendment being drafted in Senator Barnett's office that I would like permission to have printed in the Journal when it gets up here. It should be here by this afternoon sometime. And so I will give it to the Clerk and he can have it printed also, with the other amendment.

PRESIDENT: And let's hope for that then. All right, are there objections for printing in the Journal including the promised one. O.K. hearing no objections. So ordered. They will be printed in the Journal. Senator Stahmer your light is on, and you make me nervous. Thank you, Sir. We move to the General File consideration of LB870. Has the Clerk read the bill.
