PRESIDENT: Senator Stahmer voting, Senator Savage voting no. Senator Carpenter changing from yes to no. Senator Luedtke voting no. Senator Wiltse voting no. Senator Carsten voting no. Cal Carsten voting no. Senator Schmit voting aye. Senator Frank Lewis, the motion to raise the Call, if you are in favor of raising a Call of the House vote aye, if not vote no. Thank you, Clerk will record.

CLERK: 33 ayes, to Raise the Call.

PRESIDENT: The Call is RAISED. Read the talley then on the original vote. Go ahead. Stand by, just a minute. Stand by, just a minute. Senator Epke did you want to vote on the motion. Voting aye, Senator Epke voting aye. All right. It's his privilege he was here.

CLERK: 19 ayes, 21 nays, the remainder not voting.

PRESIDENT: The motion is lost. 19 and 21 nays, thank you. That particular motion is lost. How many other amendments do we have to 870.

CLERK: Motion on the desk, I move that we indefinitely postpone LB870. Signed Senator Rasmussen.

PRESIDENT: All right, the Chair recognizes, Senator Rasmussen.

SENATOR RASMUSSEN: Mr. President, and members of the body. I make the motion that we indefinitely postpone it. I'm in agreed completely with Senator Nore. This is a bad bill as far as considering outstate. I don't know about you guys, when I was campaigning all I heard was about was inspectors, inspectors and inspectors. This is just to add another fleet of cars and another fleet of men. Without doing something that I don't think is necessary. I think Senator Duis realizes his problem and his LB50. I can't see of anybody out in our area that's going to..or in matter of fact in the state that's going to benefit by this, unless it would possibly be labor. We're just creating another layer of bureaucracy. As far as I'm concerned I don't think it's necessary. I'd ask for the question. Let's kill the bill.

PRESIDENT: Senator Rasmussen has called the question. The Chair is going to ask. Does the Chair see 5 hands. The question is then, shall the debate now cease. All those in favor vote aye, all those opposed vote no. The motion is to close debate on the motion to indefinitely postpone, LB 870. We are closing debate. This is the motion to close it. Thank you, Clerk will record. 25 votes is enough.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 11 nays, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Debate will now close. Senator Rasmussen do you have any closing on your motion? All right, the question is. Shall LB870 be indefinitely postponed. All those in favor vote aye, all those opposed vote not. Motion is to indefinitely postpone LB870. The motion is to indefinitely postpone, the Chair would ask if you have all voted. Senator Frank Lewis.

SENATOR FRANK LEWIS: Mr. Chairman, I think this is a crucial bill, and I would ask that we have another Call. I apologize for it.
