PRESIDENT: It is the Chairs understanding that it would give the Governor authority to take the tax off.

SENATOR CLARK: Yes. Well in the first place, I think it probably is delegation of authority. That I don't think it would be constitutional. While I will agree with him, that something probably should be done, and I think this is strictly class legislation. I don't think it could possible be passed. I don't think it could be constitutional to do it. Therefore I would certainly oppose the amendment.

PRESIDENT: Senator Carpenter, do you want to be heard on the issue.

SENATOR CARPENTER: I move the question.

PRESIDENT: All right, Senator Kelly, are you all through. Senator Kelly is closing then, on this motion. Excuse me, Senator DeCamp did you want to be heard on this. All right, Senator Kelly. Only on your motion.

SENATOR KELLY: NO, I waived closing.

PRESIDENT: The question is, do you want to adopt the Kelly-Waldron amendment. If so, vote aye, if not vote no. You are voting on the Kelly-Waldron amendment, to 685. Have you all voted? Clerk will record. Read the results please.

CLERK: 2 ayes, 21 nays.

PRESIDENT: Thank you.

CLERK: A motion to amend the bill by Senator Carpenter. Provide that the bill will expire on January 15, 1975.

PRESIDENT: All right, Senator Carpenter.

SENATOR CARPENTER: I move for the adoption of the amendment. Just put a limiting clause on the bill, if it's finally passed. It would automatically be expired on the 15th day of March next year.

PRESIDENT: Any further discussion of that amendment. Senator Simpson.

SENATOR SIMPSON: Mr. President, that's already on the bill. That's one of the amendments that we adopted, March 15, 1975 is the end of the operative.

PRESIDENT: It is already on the bill. Senator Carpenter.

SENATOR CARPENTER: We adopted that.

PRESIDENT: All right. Do you want to withdraw the amendment then there.

SENATOR CARPENTER: Well, we have already adopted the committee amendment.
