SENATOR BARNETT: That's right, that's correct, sir.

PRESIDENT: Well, under the rules of the Legislature, I'd think that appears to the Chair that the question can be divided, that that...it can be...as far as I'm concerned, it would be all right. Well, stand by.

SENATOR BARNETT: Well, I withdraw my request. I withdraw it if it's going to be too complicated, I'll just withdraw it.

PRESIDENT: Well...it isn't that, I don't know that the Chair can determine whether this is a reconsideration or not in that how do you...well, you're striking the Syas amendment yes, it's a reconsideration. It would take 25 votes to override it, we'll go from that point. The Cavanaugh amendment will require 25 votes in order to be adopted because it's a reconsideration actually of the earlier Syas amendment. The Chair will rule that way. You can take it from there. Have you all voted? You're voting on the Syas amendment. Excuse me, you're voting on the Cavanaugh amendment which would strike the Syas amendment, strike the reference to partisan where it appears in the bill. Have you all voted? Clerk will record. Read the results, please.

CLERK: 11 ayes, 16 nays.

PRESIDENT: Okay, the Cavanaugh amendment is rejected.

CLERK: Mr. President, I now have a motion to adjourn. And I've got.....

PRESIDENT: All right now, the Chair is now to the point where we now have a motion to adjourn.....
