

Legislature will have to be first on the agenda here. The motion to override the Governor's veto was somewhat out of position, but that can be considered actually at any time, but that was in order but if you could hold your motion on these until we finish the Final Reading, fine, then we will move into that direction.

SENATOR MARVEL: I would be glad to do that with the understanding that as soon as we get through those two items I can make the motion to at least attempt to get these bills on General File so that we can discuss them as soon as possible.

PRESIDENT: Excellent. Senator Carpenter, for what purpose do you rise.

SENATOR CARPENTER: Can we read today legally the bills that are set for tomorrow, the 20th?

PRESIDENT: I believe so.

SENATOR CARPENTER: Then I would like to move that we suspend the rules and read a...a...and vote on the bills today and those which are set for the 20th. If the Clerk be allowed to read rapidly and quietly the members will not be confined to their seats but to the room unless excused by the presiding officer.

PRESIDENT: Do you all understand the motion? Motion is to suspend the rules and take up tomorrow's Final Reading in addition to the one bill scheduled for today. The Clerk be instructed to read quietly and that the Senators be allowed to move about in the room that with the instruction if they leave they are not notify the presiding officer. Senator Dickinson do you want to speak to the motion?

SENATOR DICKINSON: Yes, Mr. President, I do. Unless there is some compelling reason to suspend the rules and read tomorrow's final reading today, I oppose this motion. I think that the people are interested in the Final Reading bills and I happen to know of an instance where there are going to be some people here tomorrow morning just to observe the reading and what happens to these bills and I think that it is totally unfair to the public unless there is some compelling reason to take these bills out of order. I propose that we leave them as they are and take them as they come.

PRESIDENT: Senator Dickinson, could the Chair suggest that you make the exception for that...it might be advantageous that you make an exception of the bills that you know people want to hear for tomorrow. Is there...and I'm injecting myself then to a motion here. Senator Carpenter.

SENATOR CARPENTER: I ask unanimous consent to withdraw the motion, and so ordered. Leave it there then.

PRESIDENT: He is asking unanimous consent to withdraw the motion so ordered. Alright we are ready for the Final reading of LB972. Stand by, we will clear the floor and get the Senators in their seats, please.
