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considerably to let some county commissioners in another county to get off the political hook to change their salaries at a more decent level and certainly if we can do that, we can support a bill that would restrict horse racing on Sunday to a county for Atokad for the use that they use for their "profits".

PRESIDENT: Are you through, Senator Kelly? Senator Richendifer.

SENATOR RICHENDIFER: Mr. Chairman, members. I'd like to ask Senator Murphy a question first.

PRESIDENT: Do you yield, Senator Murphy?

SENATOR RICHENDIFER: What time do these races usually start during the day, particularly what time would they start on Sunday?

SENATOR MURPHY: Two o'clock in the afternoon.

SENATOR RICHENDIFER: Do you know of any churches that have services afternoon?

SENATOR MURPHY: No, I'm sorry I don't. Although I would yield to being all that familiar with it.

SENATOR RICHENDIFER: It wouldn't necessarily interfere with the church services then?

SENATOR MURPHY: I'm sure it wouldn't. Anyone who was so inclined is not mandated to do anything other than what he wishes and it's my hope that this Body would see fit to do the same for others.

SENATOR RICHENDIFER: For that reason, I would object to bring this bill back. Another question in my mind, if there was counsel in Council Bluffs, if there was a racetrack and they had Sunday racing, I'd think probably Omaha would be entirely in favor of this bill. So, I do not think it is necessary to bring this bill back just to amend Omaha out. Probably in two or three years, if they get a race track in Council Bluffs, they'll have Sunday racing. And then Omaha will want back in again. Let's leave the bill like it is. Pass it on and let the people in Dakota County have their Sunday racing.

PRESIDENT: Senator Syas.

SENATOR SYAS: I was in hopes that Senator Kelly would be listening because he made a statement concerning me and I take exception to it for the simple reason is that I didn't care if that amendment on that bill passed or not. I did not initiate it. I didn't care what this Legislature did about the \$15,000 and the \$12,000 situation. I didn't ask for it and I, the fact is Senator Carpenter asked....put the amendment in so how he can pin that on me is....I'll....I'd like to know. It's very easy to charge somebody with something that had nothing to do with it. And I had certainly nothing to do with that one. I didn't know it was going to come about so I don't particularly appreciate the statements. You can make all the statements you want about me as long as I've done something but this case and I do plenty that you can make statements about, but in this case I had nothing to do with it and I don't appreciate the statement.
