Few people are willing to stand up and say lets try and solve the problem. Well LB972 is an effort to try and solve the problem. It won't solve the whole problem in the area of ADC but it is a step forward and we should take it for those that believe in the reterick that Senator DeCamp has has a...a..here I might say that you are in very deep trouble as far as your thinking goes if you think that this bill can change any of what he has led you to believe.

PRESIDENT: Motion is to reconsider your action on LB972 and the Chair recognizes SENator Nore.

SENATOR NORE: Mr. Chairman, fellow members, I realize that Senator Waldron has a great deal of experience in the family problem of raising children. I don't see how he could be an authority because he hasn't had any experience. I think that it is a tragedy for children to come home when the mother isn't there. They come home to an empty house. I think that many of the marital problems start when the mother goes to work. It ends up on ADC. I would like to say to Senator DeCamp, I think that instead of getting away from home base you are coming back to home base. I think that it is one of the finest presentations that I have heard on this body since I have been here in ten years. It has a lot of good horse sense. Now these, these child commune's, I call them fareing pens. That is what we call them in Nebraska and I'm not for them on...unless they are on a private operation I think that we should probably give these mothers enough ADC so that they could afford to hire a baby sitter who will teach those children, her philosophy and I know that I have said again and I must say again that in the east we have documentary films showing where some some of these centers are teaching these children various philosophies to over come the government. Shoot the policeman, hate your parents, this is going on. I know that it is hard or a little difficult for some of us to understand these things, but lets get practical about it. MOthers when they are rearing their families should be home. If a child isn't corrected from three years up to 15 they are lost, most of them.

PRESIDENT: Senator Schmit, Kelly Dickinson, Carpenter.

SENATOR SCHMIT: Mr. President, members of the legislature, I rise in opposition to bringing the bill back, however I do have some misgivings about it. I don't want to point out here very briefly that we are going to send a million dollars of state money on principally persons who are ADC cases and yesterday when I had a bill before this legislature which would have provided for those fathers to pay the child support

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in order to minimize this type of expense, this legislature chose not to go along with it. I would hopefully suggest that in the future we would act a little more responsibly in this area.
