PRESIDENT: Will the Legislature please come to order. We are ready for prayer by Reverend Hezmall.

REVEREND HEZMALL: Gave prayer.

PRESIDENT: Roll Call. Have you all indicated your presence? Clerk will record.

CLERK: Quorum present.

PRESIDENT: Are there corrections for the Journal?

CLERK: Gave Journal corrections.

PRESIDENT: Are there additional corrections from the floor? If not, then the Journal stands as corrected. Do we have petitions, memorials, notice of committee hearings or reports?

CLERK: Mr. President your Committee on Enrollment Review reports she did on this day present to the Governor for his approval LB972, signed, Barbara Jackson, Enrolling Clerk.
