PRESIDENT: Very good, Senator Schmit. Motion is adopted.

SENATOR SCHMIT: Mr. President, members of the legislature, I move the bill be readvanced to E & R.

PRESIDENT: You heard the motion to readvance LB1028 as amended by President or a...a..Senator Schmit. All those in favor of readvancing the bill please say aye, those opposed say no, ayes have it so ordered. Bill is readvanced.

SENATOR SCHMIT: A...

CLERK: None.

PRESIDENT: Very good, we will now move to General File. First bill on General File this afternoon, we will call it LB1053.

CLERK: Read LB1053

PRESIDENT: Chair recognizes Senator Carpenter.

SENATOR CARPENTER: A point of order. I request that the bill be read.

PRESIDENT: Senator Carpenter has requested that the bill be read. Does the Chair presume Senator Carpenter that you want it read straight through? Alright.

CLERK: Read LB1053

(Start belt #3A)

PRESIDENT: Just a minute Vince, Senator Goodrich for what purpose do you rise?

SENATOR GOODRICH: Mr. President, members of the body, Senator Carpenter made a motion right?

PRESIDENT: That is correct.

SENATOR GOODRICH: We did not take a vote on that motion, and I call for a vote on that motion.

PRESIDENT: That is a request and it is allowable under the rules of the legislature. All it takes is one Senator to request the bill be read and that is it. Senator Carpenter.

SENATOR CARPENTER: If someone makes a motion to suspend the rules, and admits that you don't want to listen to the bill be read, I have no objection.

PRESIDENT: Does the Chair hear such a motion? Now then, maybe the Chair could make this request that is that it has been requested that the bill be read, if we can hold the confusion
