SENATOR CHAMBERS: I would like to pose a question.

SENATOR CARPENTER: I suggest to the Chair that he pass over the question.

PRESIDENT: Well, thank you, Senator Carpenter, I appreciate your suggestion. Senator Chambers, the rules require you to be here and I...you and I both know this and you are a gentleman and I don't find any problem at all with that particular situation. I've never seen you leave the chamber without letting me know of your actions and I appreciate that. And I think that is as far as the discussion needs to go. Now, attention please, the Final Reading of....whoops, what's the number?

CLERK: LB614.

PRESIDENT: LB614. Thank you. Clerk will read the bill.

CLERK: Read LB614.

PRESIDENT: Let's keep the volume up on the bill, please. Is the Clerk's microphone on, please?

CLERK: Yes, it is. Continue reading LB614.

PRESIDENT: All provisions of law relative to procedure having been complied with, the question is, shall the bill pass with the emergency clause attached? All those in favor vote aye. All those opposed vote no. Once again, have you all voted? Have you all voted? Clerk will record.

CLERK: Read vote. 34 ayes, 12 nays, 3 not voting.

PRESIDENT: The bill is passed with the emergency clause attached. Attention please, the Final Reading of LB629. Assistant Clerk will read the bill.

CLERK: Read LB629.
