SENATOR SYAS: Motion at the bottom of any underlined bills that even...they're not all up there yet so we can't... can't that be understood. Any underlined bill just comes after it. Underlined bills are the special bills that each senator had to pick one.

PRESIDENT: That's fine with the Chair. Just so the Body knows what we're doing.

SENATOR GOODRICH: That's fine with me.

PRESIDENT: All right. All right. Do you...Senator Keyes, for what purpose do you rise?

SENATOR KEYES: Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Go ahead, sir. Yeah.

SENATOR KEYES: If I'm on, I just want to remind you that we have a lot of very important bills. Forty votes will keep us here till Christmas.

PRESIDENT: Senator Skarda, did you want to be heard on the issue here? All right now, do you want to try a unanimous consent motion, Senator Snyder? All right, unanimous consent motion by Senator Snyder to put LB1026 behind any other underlined bills on General File. Are there objections to placing LB1026 in that position? Hearing none, so ordered. Are you objecting? All right. Hearing none, so ordered. LB1026 goes there then. All right.

CLERK: Mr. President, unanimous consent to publish amendments in the Journal.

PRESIDENT: So ordered.

CLERK: Mr. President, a Resolution LRI31 will be inserted in the Journal.

PRESIDENT: So ordered.

CLERK: Mr. President, I ask unanimous consent to bracket LB705 for consideration on General File Tuesday, March 26. Signed, Senator Chambers.

PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes Senator Chambers for his motion of LB705.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. President and members of the Legislature. This bill relates to some changes that would occur in the procedure by which bar examinations are administered. The Supreme Court has adopted a rule which is close to paralleling this bill but in order for the rule, which they adopted, to be effectuated, this bill must be acted on because to obtain a copy of an examination, a statutory fee is to be paid. The fee that would be required is contained in LB705. I think the bill is essential, I'm going to run the risk of tossing it out on these troubled waters in the form of a unanimous consent motion that it can be considered in time to get across the board before this session ends.
