SENATOR CARPENTER: Now, both of these gentlemen have a point. I would suggest that Senator Stahmer withdraw his motion and let me put on the desk the resolution which would, if adopted, would follow with a public hearing before Senator Syas' committee. That would probably be the real and legitimate way to do it. We're all trying to do the same thing.

SENATOR STAHMER: I accept and I will withdraw.

SENATOR CARPENTER: Mr. President, I move.....

PRESIDENT: Senator Carpenter.

SENATOR CARPENTER: We suspend the rules and introduce the resolution with the understanding it will be heard through hearing with Senator Syas' Constitutional Committee.

PRESIDENT: Right, we'll have to take care of the other resolutions here first. Move to those. Senator Carpenter's resolution will come up after the others. Take up the resolutions on the desk. Now, wait a minute. Wait a minute. Now, Senator Syas, for what purpose do you rise?

SENATOR SYAS: Well, I'm.....

PRESIDENT: We're not ready to discuss Senator Carpenter's resolution yet.

SENATOR SYAS: I'm trying to find out what it's about. Now he wants to introduce the bill...the resolution?

PRESIDENT: Yes, sir.

SENATOR SYAS: Okay, now do...it's introduced, right.

PRESIDENT: No, sir. It's in line here to be introduced and we're going to take it in its order but the other resolutions are on the desk ahead of it and he has to wait his turn.

SENATOR SYAS: All right, as soon as you come to that one, I'll make a motion to suspend the rules and set the resolution for next Wednesday at 12:45.

CLERK: Read LR132. (Found on page 1263-64 of Journal).

PRESIDENT: So ordered. Stand by just a second, Senator Carpenter. I think we have.....

CLERK: Read LR133. (Found on pages 126465 of JOURNAL)

PRESIDENT: Senator Carpenter.

SENATOR CARPENTER: Now, Mr. President, I don't want to get into discussion of the contents of this resolution. That'll be taken care of by the committee itself eventually whether or not this Body wants to accept or not accept the contents or the revision, any form you want to have it. This is the only vehicle in order to get it on record and before Senator Syas' committee to hold a public hearing on it. At that time I'm sure that everyone who's for or against will be there and they'll report a bill out if they'll report one out for this Body to discuss. I hope we'll not get into the details because I'm not concerned about the details. The
