

PRESIDENT: Very good, but Senator Carpenter we have a problem that if

(start belt #7)

we don't have a written motion in front of us and I think that you should once again explain your motion so that we will have it. As a matter of fact, I may have mis-stated something here where you could have misunderstood this. The Chair understands that he wants to suspend the rules, take up the underlined bills then....we consider the committee amendments only.

SENATOR CARPENTER: WE only take up the bills which are underlined on General File. We adopt by specific action on each bill where there is a committee amendment, the committee amendment. After that, we have done that I would suggest by unanimous consent that we move the bill from general file to E & R Initial. When you get over to Select File, if we do, then you can offer any other amendment except the committee amendments to whatever extent that you desire. After that time we will discuss the bill as a whole as if it were on General File as we normally do. Now the only thing that I have in mind is to attempt to bring about the underlined bill so that when we come back here on Monday, we probably we have it on Select File. It is only a method of expediting the business. You are in no better or worse position than you are in now, by leaving them on General file. Then we also have the other information as to how much time we have left to discuss the appropriation bill before we have to pass them whether we know what is in them or not. That is the motion and the Clerk will write it out and I will sign it.

PRESIDENT: Senator Simpson do you understand the jest of the motion then? Senator Simpson.

SENATOR SIMPSON: Mr. President, yes I think I do, I disagree with a couple of points and I would only speak to what I think would be a clarification. The first of all any bill that is on general file has a kill motion that might be on this list should not move, but the kill motion should be taken there and secondly if we are going to just take the standing committee amendments, fine put them on, then I think any other motion or any other amendments should be put into the Journal with the bill as it moves to the next order and then I believe that we are going to have to vote not unanimous consent but we are going to have to vote to take them off of general file. I think that I should move to amend his motion that we should have to vote by majority of the elected members to take them off of general file. If they don't have that kind of support going off in any form then they shouldn't move to Select File and just clutter us up.

PRESIDENT: It was never the Chair's understanding that we were taking anything less than a majority of the elected.

SENATOR SIMPSON: His motion does. His motion says unanimous consent.

PRESIDENT: Ok, alright. Read the motion now.
