PRESIDENT: Anybody...any further discussion? Senator Burbach, Senator Nore, have their lights on. They're passing? Senator Carpenter, you ready for the question?

SENATOR CARPENTER: No closing.

PRESIDENT: Question is, the adoption of the Carpenter amendment to the Carpenter amendment. All those in favor vote aye. Those opposed vote no. This calls for a...a majority of those voting because it's Senator Carpenter's amendment and he, as I understand the rules, he's entitled to any form he wants it in. Because he can always re-submit it anyway. Have you all voted? Printed in the Journal also. Record the vote. Yeah, I'm counting the vote. Record it.

CLERK: 15 ayes, 8 nays.

PRESIDENT: The amendment's adopted. That'll be printed in the Journal and we'll take this up tomorrow unless there's some objection. Any objections to that? Senator Stull.

SENATOR STULL: Point of order, we're on Select File. Wouldn't it take 25 votes to adopt an amendment? Not to amend an amendment? Okay.

PRESIDENT: Senator, this is possibly debatable but the point, I think, here is that it's Senator Carpenter's amendment. He can put it in any form he wants by re-submitting it. And so it's an amendment to an amendment, I rule that it would take a majority of those voting. But to adopt an amendment as such does takes 25 votes.

CLERK: Now, Mr. President, Senator Carpenter asked unanimous consent to print another amendment in the Journal and then Senator Burbach has asked unanimous consent to print amendments in the Journal.

PRESIDENT: That's ordered.

CLERK: Mr. President, your Committee on Enrollment Review reports we have examined and reviewed LB499 and LB499A, 602, 710, 789, 790, 790A, 921, 995, 1003, 1004 and 1024 and find them all correctly enrolled. Signed, John Cavanaugh, Chairman.

PRESIDENT: Senator Frank Lewis and then Senator Syas.

SENATOR F. LEWIS: Mr. Chairman, I'd ask unanimous consent to print an amendment germane to LB1054...LB1053 subject under debate now in the Journal for today also.

PRESIDENT: Any objection, so ordered. Senator Syas.

SENATOR SYAS: Thursday we have a public...two bills before the Constitutional Revision Committee and I'd like to have unanimous consent to see...I understand we're going to have a large crowd and I'd like to have unanimous consent to use at 12:45 the East Senate Chamber.

PRESIDENT: Any objections to Senator Syas using the East Senate Chamber for this hearing?

SENATOR SYAS: That's Thursday.

PRESIDENT: Hearing Thursday. Senator Syas wants to use the East Senate Chamber. Any objections? So ordered.
