PRESIDENT: Senator R. Lewis.

SENATOR R. LEWIS: I move the previous question, let's get to going.

PRESIDENT: Question's been called for. Do I see five hands? All those in favor of closing debate vote aye. Those opposed vote no. You all voted? Clerk will record.

CLERK: 35 ayes, 2 nays to close debate.

PRESIDENT: Debate is closed. Senator Warner is now closing.

SENATOR WARNER: Mr. President, I'll waive closing, the adequacy of discussion, I think, is evident.

PRESIDENT: Senator Barnett. For what purpose do you rise?

SENATOR BARNETT: Mr. President, I'd ask unanimous consent for Roll Call vote and start at the end of the alphabet.

PRESIDENT: You don't have to ask unanimous consent. The rules provide that if a member request a Roll Call vote, he shall get it. Now, make your request.

SENATOR BARNETT: And my unanimous consent is to start at the rear of the alphabet.

PRESIDENT: That's the way it shall be done. Now, here is the question. The question is, shall the bill pass notwithstanding the objection of the Governor? All those in favor. Clerk will call the Roll.

CLERK: Roll Call Vote. (See results on page 1349 of Journal). 30 ayes, 18 nays, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: The motion passes. The Governor's veto is overridden. Any motions on the Clerk's desk?

CLERK: Mr. President, your committee reports that you did on this day deliver bills to the Governor. An explanation of vote had I had been present, I would have voted for LB499. Unanimous consent to print amendments in the Journal. Mr. President, your committee reports that LB877 be replaced in Select File.

PRESIDENT: All right, are you ready to return to discussion of the Budget Bill, LB1054? Senator Marvel. May the Chair inquire, is there a bus leaving for...4:30 the Clerk advises me. Senator Marvel. While Senator Marvel is preparing himself, we will recess....stand at ease for five minutes.

CLERK: Mr. President, an explanation of vote. Had Senator Wiltse been present when the votes was taken, he would have voted aye.

PRESIDENT: The Legislature will please come to order. Let's get on with the business. Senator Marvel.
