PRESIDENT: Excuse me, Senator Marvel, Senator Cavanaugh has a question.

SENATOR MARVEL: Yes.

SENATOR CAVANAUGH: Senator Marvel, on this Vice-Chancellor's office, why is that set out like that?

SENATOR MARVEL: At the Ag College? It's a new position that was created when there was discussion last session as to whether the Ag College ought to be segregated completely and have its own Chancellor. And the compromise was reached that instead of a Chancellor on a co-equal basis with the Chancellor at the University of Nebraska-Lincoln campus, there would be a Vice-Chancellor. So the office of Dean was upgraded to that position and this man has been selected and is coming down from South Dakota. I think he's to report the 1st of April.

SENATOR CAVANAUGH: What's the \$50,000? Is that his salary or.....

SENATOR MARVEL: Not quite. He's asking me a question. No, it's not strictly salary. It's also salary plus staff to run the office.

SENATOR CAVANAUGH: But included in that \$50,000 is his personal salary?

SENATOR MARVEL: Yes, and his staff's salary and everything to run his office.

SENATOR CAVANAUGH: Why wouldn't that go in the general appropriations?

SENATOR MARVEL: Well, I suppose it could go in General Appropriation, but it appears here that since it's a new position, it ought to be emphasized so that everybody's aware of the fact that there's a new look so to speak out at the Ag College.

SENATOR CAVANAUGH: But that's all he'll get to run his office?

SENATOR MARVEL: For the first year, that's right.

SENATOR CAVANAUGH: Okay.

PRESIDENT: Is there a motion on the desk?

CLERK: Mr. President, I have a motion to adjourn--right prior to that, I have a transmittal from myself to the Secretary of State forwarding LB772 together with a letter from him acknowledging receipt of the bill on which the veto was overridden. Mr. President, I move we adjourn. Signed, Senator Carpenter.

PRESIDENT: All those in favor of adjourning, say aye. Those opposed no. We stand adjourned.
