SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. President, in order not to vote twice on whether 923 will be moved with the rest of them, I'll try to get the votes necessary to amend Senator Stull's motion. If I cannot get the votes to amend the motion, I probably couldn't get the 25 to advance it. So I move to amend Senator Stull's motion to include LB923, and it is not a bill that I sponsored, by the way.

PRESIDENT: All right, now then, Senator Chambers is asking to amend Senator Stull's motion, which would be to include LB923. If you support that amendment so that that bill is included with these others that have already been mention. Vote aye. If not vote no. The motion before us to amend the Stull motion to include LB923. That's offered as an amendment by Senator Chambers. And the Chair before we get through voting would rule that that takes 25 votes. That's an amendment to an amendment at this particular time. And it binds the body to an action on a bill. Now Senator Fellman did you have a question?
