SENATOR FELLMAN: I'm going to request a Call.

PRESIDENT: Have you all voted on the issue? Senator Fellman

SENATOR FELLMAN: Request a Call of the House.

PRESIDENT: Senator Fellman is asking for a Call of the House. Clerk will record and clear the board. Now at the next bell please indicate your support of a call of the house as requested by Senator Fellman. This bell is for a call of the house. If you support a Call of the House vote aye, if not vote no. Once again have you all voted? This is for a Call of the House. SENator Fellman asked...Have you all voted? All right, the Clerk will record.

CLERK: 14 ayes, 22 nays.

PRESIDENT: The motion is lost.

CLERK: The original vote 18 ayes, 16 nays.

PRESIDENT: The motion to amend fails. Back to the original Stull motion. Now we will read the titles to the bills... All right, let's go this procedure now. We have some confusion. The Chair is going to rule this way. Will you please pay attention The Chair's going to rule that the next motion is to suspend the rules in order to read the titles to these bills. All right SENator Duis, you will have to indicate to the Chair what your objection is.

SENATOR DUIS: I don't believe you have to suspend the rules to read the titles'

PRESIDENT: The Chair understands that. The Chair also understands that we are suspending the rules in order to consider all these bills in one mass and then read the titles and then move the bills on over.

SENATOR DUIS: Thank you very much.

PRESIDENT: O.K. Thank you. Now, Senator Chambers your light is on. Thank you, Sir. Motion is to suspend the rules, read the bills, and then we'll them on over, if you support that suspension of the rules in order to handle that way, vote aye, if not vote no. The motion is for a suspension of the rules. After that the bills on Senator Stull's motion will be read If you don't get the suspension of the rules, thank you. Clerk will record.

CLERK: 31 ayes, 2 nays.

PRESIDENT: Thank you, the rules are suspended and we will read the titles for the bills. The Chair before we begin this, and before we scatter, the Chair wants to know that the north door second floor will be open tonight, public should use this exit. The first floor door is open to persons with identification. First floor doors will be open only to persons with identification. North door second floor open tonight. Now Clerk will read the titles.
