CLERK: 37 ayes, no nays.

PRESIDENT: The bill is advanced.

CLERK: Mr. President, there is a request to print amendments to LB1055 in the Journal by Senator Stull.

PRESIDENT: Are there objections of the printing of the amendments in the Journal.

CLERK: Mr. President, I move we adjourn. Signed, Senator D. Rasmussen.

PRESIDENT: The motion is to adjourn. Senator Rasmussen. That's fine. We will either vote it up or down. The motion to adjourn, which I assume would be until 9:00 tomorrow morning. All those in favor of adjournment vote aye, all those opposed vote no. Simple majority is required. Motion before us to adjourn until 9:00 tomorrow morning. Have you all voted? CLERK will record.

CLERK: 16 ayes, 19 nays.

PRESIDENT: The motion is lost. We will continue with the debate of LB127. I assume that's the next bill underlined. Clerk will read the bill if it hasn't been read. I wonder if the Chair could call to your attention. I have rapped the gavel twice within the last thirty minutes. There is an inordinant amount of noise and confusion on the floor, and it seemsto me there out of courtesy to one another you are going to have to quiet down. I don't know how else the chair can call this to your attention, other than say please quiet down. Clerk will proceed. Senator Keyes, for what purpose do you rise, here.

SENATOR KEYES: I would like to ask if it's possible for you to tell me, who underlined this bill.

PRESIDENT: 127.

SENATOR KEYES: Yes, it's a Judiciary Committee bill, now who has underlined it. See...

PRESIDENT: Senator Luedtke do you care to respond. Senator Keyes is asking who underlined LB127.

SENATOR LUEDTKE: I think Senator Barnett did, didn't he.

PRESIDENT: All right, does that answer your question.

SENATOR KEYES: Yes, it does, I was just hoping it wasn't

PRESIDENT: Senator Marsh.

SENATOR MARCH: Senator Shirley Marsh underlined LB127.

PRESIDENT: Thank you. Now, is Senator Barnett handling the bill. All right.

SENATOR BARNETT: Mr. President and members of the Legislature. The first thing we should do is adopt the committee amendments
