

SENATOR PROUD: That was my standing.

PRESIDENT: Thank you. What is the next order of business Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Read communications. Read E & R report regarding LB1054, 1055, 1056, 1057, 1058, 1059, 1049, 932, 933, 665, 754, 754A, 757, 787 and 861A all to Select File.

PRESIDENT: Vince did you read..... Next order of business. Senator Carpenter.

SENATOR CARPENTER: (mike not activated) that because of some importance I would like move that when we adjourn today we adjourn until Monday at 10:00 so that the other members of the committees and particularly the chairman can lay out their own work and also it will help those people downstairs.

PRESIDENT: Do you want to take this up right now, or did you want to take it up when we get ready to adjourn?

SENATOR CARPENTER: I would like to take it up now so they can tell me what they are going to do.

PRESIDENT: Senator Goodrich.

SENATOR GOODRICH: I would like to support Senator Carpenter in this move. It would at least give us a sense of direction of what we have to do today, and tomorrow because we...the determination as to whether or not we can move any of those bills off general file hinges on what we are going to do about adjourning tomorrow. If we adjourn tomorrow, let the guys downstairs catch up and then we will have Monday to catch some of the General File bills and move them forward. If we don't we are going to be stuck with nothing moving forward that doesn't movethis afternoon. I would strongly urge the support of Senator Carpenter's motion to adjourn until Monday when we adjourn tonight.

PRESIDENT: I have several lights up here and I'm going to take them the best way that I can. Senator Carpenter, would you turn your light off for the present time. Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. President, members of the legislature, we are where we always are at this particular time at the end of each session. We have adopted changes in our rules that cause us to close, or to go slow and wind up in a crunch like this and I was opposed to the adoption of those rules, such as 25 votes for an amendment to a bill on General File. I am opposed to our taking tomorrow off. I know that tomorrow will probably be taken off, but I will vote against that and I'm going to vote against night sessions. I want us to roll right on through. Each day, each working day from here on to the end, and the glorious end or the inglorious end of this session. I want us to go straight through without a break, so I would oppose the motion to take tomorrow off.

PRESIDENT: Senator Rasmussen.

SENATOR RASMUSSEN: Mr. Chairman, members of the body, I'm going to oppose this motion. I can't see why three days is going to give us any more direction than the last three and I don't think there has been too much.
