PRESIDENT: The Legislature will come to order. We will have prayer by the Chaplain.

CHAPLAIN: Prayer given.

PRESIDENT: Roll call. Please indicate your presence.

CLERK: Senator Rasmussen and Senator Burbach asked to be excused today, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: So ordered. Please indicate your presence. Have you all indicated your presence. Clerk will record.

CLERK: Quorum present, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: We are properly convened. Senator Carstens.

SENATOR CARSTENS: Mr. President, I'd like to ask consent to be excused this afternoon from about 2:00 until I return.

PRESIDENT: So ordered. Any corrections of the Journal Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: None, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Any petitions or memorials.

CLERK: Mr. President a communication from the Executive Office. Under the date of March 28. This was received after adjournment last Thursday. (read) A letter from the Governor's office under date of March 29. (read) Attached thereto is a letter from the Attorney General addressed to the Governor and an earlier letter from the Governor addressed to the Congressional Delegation as well as earlier correspondence from the Governor to this Legislature. Mr. President, another communication from the Governor's office under date of March 30, which was received by me on Saturday, addressed to Mr. President, Mr. Speaker and Members of the Legislature. (read) Attached thereto is a copy of the Attorney's General's opinion together with some other correspondence on the subject. It will be inserted in full in the Journal. Mr. President we have received a report of the Nebraska Transportation Advisory Committee.

PRESIDENT: Mr. Clerk, the Chair wishes to announce that I'm going to recognize just a second here, Senator Carpenter, but the Chair wishes to announce that according to the rules we have a scheduled order of business. That is by rule. And as a..far as the chair is concerned as long as I'm up here anyway, we're not going to deviate from that order of business, except for suspension of the rules. However, considering the remarks made by the Governor's message, I'll recognize Senator Carpenter on a point of personal privilege.

SENATOR CARPENTER: Well, I don't ask for that, Mr. President. And I will conform to the rules as they and at an appropriate time I'll discuss the matter with the body.
