And that's what we're doing on a lot of these amendments. That's where our time is going. Many of these horses have been ridden by several times here this year. And I'm not opposing this particular amendment but I THINK it's....it used to be, I believe some years ago, when an amendment failed on...or a bill didn't get enough votes, it went to the bottom of the list. And this is where we're sort of hung up. We're never going to get on that...those underlined bills because we're going to keep running back those lame horses every day and every day, we're going to run them by hoping they'll be accepted.

PRESIDENT: Any further discussion? Senator Goodrich? Senator Simpson.

SENATOR SIMPSON: Mr. President, I wonder if Senator Goodrich would yield to a question?

SENATOR GOODRICH: Yes.

SENATOR SIMPSON: Senator Goodrich, all I've ever heard on this \$15,000 that it's miscellaneous expense. And I wonder if you could explain what this miscellaneous expense is for my benefit.

SENATOR GOODRICH: Sure, I'd be glad to. What it boils down to, these are kids that plain haven't got the money to even go to lunch half the time. What it boils down to, we find that some of them haven't even got bus fare to get to school so consequently we're picking a very small amount like this to give the director of that program at UN-O some operating money with which he can take care of some of the miscellaneous trivial needs of these kids. Now, for example, last year they also had an occasion where they took one group on a trip to Chicago. That was a freshman group and they took the senior...or excuse me....sophomore year, second year group to Washington D. C. to study government in Washington D. C. This is the type of expenses that we're talking about.
