PRESIDENT: Senator Barnett.

SENATOR BARNETT: Well, Mr. President, I've got to ask Senator Goodrich a question because he's thoroughly got me confused now. Senator Goodrich, yesterday you amended the same thing with the same answer. Only it's a different number.

SENATOR GOODRICH: Now, that was the operating budget for next year.

SENATOR BARNETT: It was still for the poor.

SENATOR GOODRICH: Now, wait a minute. Now that...first of all, you've got to remember that the \$15,000 amendment we were talking about was the operating budget for next year and it did not pass.

SENATOR BARNETT: That was two days ago?

SENATOR GOODRICH: Yes.

SENATOR BARNETT: Okay, yesterday....

SENATOR GOODRICH: It did not pass.

SENATOR BARNETT: Yesterday you amended a bill and said it was the underprivileged so that they could go to schools.

SENATOR GOODRICH: Now, that was a \$50,000 item, also in the operating budget for next year but it was for tuition remission.

SENATOR BARNETT: So then what have you got here?

SENATOR GOODRICH: This is not tuition remission. This is operating expense. Miscellaneous operating expense.

SENATOR BARNETT: You just told Simpson it was for lunch money.

SENATOR GOODRICH: Well, what the devil you call it? Lunch money, call it anything you want. Transportation money, trip to wherever they have to take these kids for field trips and that sort of thing.

SENATOR BARNETT: Well, I don't know, looks like everyone of these bills you're coming in with, you've got me....I can't go for this one.

SENATOR GOODRICH: Well, frankly this one is not a big deal. It's \$15,000 in the deficiency appropriation so they can use it to survive the rest of this year. I call for the question.

SENATOR BARNETT: No response.

PRESIDENT: Well, I don't believe anybody else is asking for the floor right now that's in their seats. Do you want to close, Senator Goodrich? Senator Goodrich waives closing. The question now is the adoption of the rejection of the Goodrich amendment to LB1059. All those in favor of the Goodrich amendment vote aye. Those opposed vote no. This is the Goodrich amendment to LB1059. Have you all voted? Clerk will record.
