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moving to regionalization concept and I believe that the city of Omaha will operate a large portion of the services that we are discriminating in that manner and that it is imperative that we have direct state contact with services being discriminated and the fate of metropolitan Omaha and in order to do that I think that we must have facilities adequate to house those persons charged with the responsibility of providing those services to the people of the city of Omaha and I move the bill be advanced.

SPEAKER: Senator Whitney.

SENATOR WHITNEY: Mr. President, members of the legislature, I want to caution this body that we are getting into a situation here where we are spending too much money. Now for example we are already 17 to 20 million dollars behind in appropriations already. When you realize that we have to have this 5% reserve, we are already 17 million dollars to 20 million dollars behind. Now this means that definitely that this passes that we are going to have to have a 4% sales tax come next year and we are definitely going to have to have 20% income tax come January 1st next year

SPEAKER: One minute left.

SENATOR WHITNEY: And this and another thing we have an extra 9 million dollars that we have already appropriated on capital construction and if we have a considerable reduction in prices like we have had in the last two months, then the wheat going down over \$200 a bushel, we are going to have to have additional sales taxes and additional income taxes above what I have just said. I want to caution this body, that we simply are asking for too much money. Now we have gotten along so far and I feel that we should continue to rent, buildings from private enterprise and rather than to advance our spendings as greatly as we are in this session. I just feel that we are definitely going way too high in our expenditures and I wish to caution you that we should hold down on expenditures.

SPEAKER: Time is up, debate has ceased. We are now ready to vote on the advancement of the bill. All the amendments have been taken care of haven't they? All those in favor of advancing this bill vote aye, those opposed vote no. Motion is to advance the bill. Have you all voted? Clerk will record.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 8 nays Mr. President.

SPEAKER: Bill is advanced. The next bill is LB678.

CLERK: Read LB678

SPEAKER: Senator Stahmer.

SENATOR STAHMER: Mr. President, I would like to say that I underlined this bill for my good friends in Lincoln and I appreciate their help to the Joslyn Art Museum.
