CLERK: 28 ayes, 3 nays.

PRESIDENT: Committee amendment is adopted. Now, Senator DeCamp. Senator Waldron.

SENATOR WALDRON: I move to advance to E & R for Review.

PRESIDENT: All right, the motion's been made to advance the bill. Is there any discussion? Are you ready for the question? Question is, shall the bill be advanced. All those in favor vote aye. Those opposed vote no. Clerk will record.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 4 nays, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: The bill is advanced. Clerk read LB632.

CLERK: Read LB632.

PRESIDENT: Are there any amendments, Mr. Clerk?

CLERK: There are no committee amendments, Mr. President. There are voluminous amendments offered by Senator Carpenter. A 25-page amendment by Senator Carpenter.

PRESIDENT: Anybody familiar with Senator Carpenter's amendments? Senator Keyes.

SENATOR KEYES: Yes, Mr. Speaker, Senator Carpenter's amendment will be followed by an amendment that is exactly the one I have in there and this is to take the food tax off. We discussed that very thoroughly the other day. We didn't seem to get enough votes for it. I have an amendment following that's going to increase it up to it I believe \$16 a hundred if....I won't speak for Carpenter's for I will withdraw my amendment.

PRESIDENT: Now, I want to know right now whether anybody wants to take up Senator Carpenter's amendments. If nobody does, we're going to pass them over. Does anybody want to take up those amendments? For the last time. Pass them over. Clerk will read any other amendment.
