PRESIDENT: Sneator Snyder will you explain them.

SENATOR SNYDER: Yes, Mr. President, this was one of a series of about four bills, as I recall. The specifics to the intent of LB1026 provides that an ordinance enacted by the governing body of the city or village may be submitted to the voters of such city for approval. But no ordinance shall become law with out the approval of majority of voters. And on page 1257 in the journal it specifies those projects in which this area of legislation relates to. Specifically ordinances establishing or changing utility system rates and charges, pay rates and salaries for city employees, the mayor and city council. Ordinances taking action as to which statutes are applicable, which provide the means for the voters to accept or reject city council action in those areas. So I guess the first thing is to move for the adoption of the amendment as laid out in the Journal.

PRESIDENT: I think you've got to...I think Senator Snyder you've got an amendment to an amendment.

SENATOR SNYDER: All right, then so I first thing then is to move for the adoption of the amendment on the Clerk's desk to the amendment that was printed in the ;journal prior to that.

PRESIDENT: Yes, that's right, isn't it Mr. Clerk? Say what you said again.

SENATOR SNYDER: The first amendment was printed in the Journal this one?

CLERK: On page 1257, the second one was printed in the Journal on page 1359.

SENATOR SNYDER: All right then, I move for the adoption of the amendment printed on page 1359.

PRESIDENT: This is to the amendment.

SENATOR SNYDER: Yes.

PRESIDENT: All right, Senator Frank Lewis.

SENATOR FRANK LEWIS: Mr. Chairman this particular provision also affects the public schools, and it affects any kind of contracting, and it's going to create some real problems if we don't rectify it.

PRESIDENT: All right, this is the Snyder amendment to the Snyder amendment requires a majority of those voting. All those in favor say aye. Opposed no. Amendment is adopted. Senator Snyder.

SENATOR SNYDER: Now, Mr. President I would move for the adoption of the amendment as amended. Which is on page 1257.

PRESIDENT: You have already explained that haven't you?

SENATOR SNYDER: Yes, I explained them together.

PRESIDENT: Any further discussion. All th ose in favor of the amendment vote aye. Those opposed v ote no. Clerk will record.

CLERK: 26 ayes, no nays, Mr. President.
