CLERK: 25 ayes, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: The amendment is adopted. Do we have other amendments to the bill?

CLERK: I don't at this time, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: All right. Oh, stand by, another amendment being written.

CLERK: Mr. President, an amendment offered to LB681. Add a new section which would amend 53-117 and provides that where sold on an unlicensed premise, on any premise in violation of law, to bring an action to enjoin the use of the property for such purpose. Signed, Senator DeCamp.

SENATOR DE CAMP: Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes Senator DeCamp.

SENATOR DE CAMP: Mr. President, this was an amendment we adopted on LB616 which later failed and all it does is correct an error in the law from the time the liquor laws were originally drafted. The Liquor Commission has authority to check and supervise and control licensed premises but if somebody sets up an unlicensed premise and starts selling liquor without any license or anything, they have no authority to go in there. And I couldn't believe it so I checked with the Attorney General and he checked it out and he wrote an opinion saying yes, that is the case. So all this does is give the Liquor Commission the authority also to check on....
