If it does well, the members, if it does evil, then I do bear the responsibility, and I made a mistake on that. But they come right in with the very same bill and offer an amendment to get around the requirements of this city charter. I want to read you something from the bill, and then I'll stop. The issue...this is from the bill...you can read it with me if you want to...It's on page 2 starting at line 16. The issuance of bonds by any county, city or village under the authority of this section shall not be subject to any charter or statutory limitations of indebtedness, or be subject to any restrictions imposed upon or conditions precedent to the exercise of the power of the counties, cities and villages to issue bonds or evidences of indebtedness which may be contained in such counties or other statute. I hope you understand what was read.

CLERK: Senator Nore asked for a record vote, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Thank you, the question is, shall LB678 be returned to select file. For a specific amendment. That is the amendment offered by Senator Chambers, and this is the motion to return the bill only. The question, is shall 678 be returned. All those in favor vote aye. All those opposed vote no. Have you all voted. Once again, have you all voted. The motion is to return 678 to Select File for specific amendment. Now then, Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. President, I must ask for a Call of the House.

PRESIDENT: All right, the Clerk will clear the board.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: I ask unanimous consent to withdraw that motion.

PRESIDENT: That motion is withdrawn, all right.

CLERK: voting aye 25, voting nay 14, not voting 10
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PRESIDENT: Senator Lewis, I'm sorry I can't take your vote because it wasn't punched in. It's already moved..the question now here anyway. The action has been taken. Now, 678 then is returned to Select File.

CLERK: Now Mr. President, the motion is to adopt the specific amendment. Signed, Senator Chambers.

PRESIDENT: All right, Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. President, I will not offer any debate on it. I have said already everything that I could. And it is a serious question.

PRESIDENT: All right, Senator Carpenter. And then Senator Nore.

SENATOR CARPENTER: Well, I just want to ask one question. Is this bill now as it now stands cover a first class city?
